It has been a very challenging time for children and parents and in my case I was very disappointed that there was no online interaction. A simple quiz once a week on Zoom with children who wanted to take part would of been good (I suggested to the teacher).  The BBC Bitesize materials were easy to follow. I liked the other, family activities suggested in the weekly newsletters too.

6 Do you believe the additional safety measures and procedures put in place for the children returning to school were clearly communicated to parents/ carers?

I'd had enough of trying to entertain them.

- Details were shared well in advance and all concerns answered Letters gave lots of information.
- Had letters with information about how things would be different to keep everyone safe e.g. staggered times, bubble groups, cleaning
- Newsletter from Mrs Mullane and the arrangements for each class who returned in June were helpful. They explained what the school was doing to keep everyone safe.
- Knowing what all measures are in place and followed by the kids in nursery would be helpful. E.g. are they social distancing in the nursery class? How do they have their snacks? How do they mostly spend time with friends around? My child most of the times has dirty mouth and hands when I pick her up, are they not being told to wash themselves after having snack? As a parent, I keep telling my child to make sure she washes her hand and mouth but is that not something communicated to the children after snack time? Completely understand it can be very difficult with young minds.

# 7 Do you believe the additional safety measures and procedures put in place for the children returning to school made myself and my children feel safe and confident to return?

- Children felt safe and protected but also happy to be there. I never got the information

## 9 In light of your experience during the Covid19 pandemic, is there anything we could have done better? Please provide details.

- Online Zoom class even once a week would have been effective.
- Daily online lecture of I-2 hours on Zoom/teams during lockdown weeks and even after
- Yes, maybe in future if we return back to home school learning and my children stay at home, I would ask if the teacher can do
  online lessons, that would be great.
- Some virtual classes would have been nice
- Sometimes I felt that I needed support as to what topics should I cover with my daughter at home on weekly basis. Especially at the beginning after the school closed. Maybe recorded videos from the teacher highlighting the main learning objectives of each week to parents could have been helpful. I felt overwhelmed not knowing what to revise with her, especially in maths and sciences.
- Update more to the parents about the next new years in school, how it is going to happen, what's going to happen all this information is lacking!
- Better learning plan for the kids. Interactive over Zoom or MS teams where the kids got some social interaction. Submitting work and getting feedback. Better planned work that was not just BBC bitesize. Maybe a call from the teacher for a catch-up
- No especially after speaking with friends about their children's experiences, Mersey Vale couldn't have done more.
- Improve communication with parents/ carers
- Maybe online lessons (2)
- Provided children with work. Was unable to connect to dojo. Other than one phone call to see if kids were ok, there was no educational support materials for kids
- Not currently
- It would have been better if more children had been able to return but that wasn't the fault of the school.
- Could some class Zoom meetings have been offered once a week? It might have been good to have children speaking to teachers.
- Key worker group time if become flexible will be more helpful
- Mersey Vale has done what any parents would expect, I don't have anything to add to it

- My son was so worried about his missed school days and the time he couldn't spent with his class teacher and friends. It would have been better if he could join with the teacher at least once a week in an online video teaching session.
- The school could have provided more paper homework.
- I would have liked to have seen the delivery of a couple of hours a day of online lessons by the teachers for those in KS2. With packs given out for those who could not/did not want to access it.
- Need to start regular Zoom classes
- You have done brilliant Job

- Some of the learning resources are a bit scattered, for example some on school website, some on ClassDojo, some in links in texts, was easy to miss stuff. Maybe just have everything in one place

- Online learning, checking on work and giving feedback
- I-2 hour video lessons daily with the class teacher.
- Children in school doing mathematics and hone learning packs earlier on
- More live / daily lessons with pupils e.g. Zoom or Seesaw. More interaction with pupils.
- As mentioned previously, online Google classroom/Zoom and more online interactions with teacher and pupils not just a general message on ClassDojo. Video/telephone calls with children to see how they are getting on. Weekly quizzes for the class so the whole class can interact with each other.

- No I have been more than happy with what school have done.

- Provide better support for home learning. Video lessons, on line learning, some sort of video teacher to pupil supervision (even 15 minutes a week would have been important). The children were left completely alone and without motivation with that BBC grid
- Yes, one call from the teacher would have made a huge difference as I am sure my child would have been so happy. As you may understand it was a very difficult time for them to be away from school. Maybe one Zoom session with their classmates and teacher would have made a lot of difference. Personal touch to see how the kids were doing lacked while I know other schools did ring parents to check and have a 5 min conversation with the children.
- Learning grid to of been Explained more better which links to certain subjects
- Introduce flexi-learning option, part-time schooling, classes of 15 one week and swap next week. Hard for working parents, maybe trial it, smaller classes able to distance and even teach better. Results may improve as kids value their schooling. Just as Covid 19 is major threat and we have no idea if autumn/winter will make spread worse. Flexi-schooling maybe option for younger years or worried parents, maybe survey parents about option of flexi-schooling at least in autumn/winter, as it's our first year with this new virus.
