

INSTRUMENT OF GOVERNMENT FOR COMMUNITY SCHOOLS (School Standards and Framework Act 1998)



- I. The name of the school is Mersey Vale Primary School
- 2. The school is a **community school**.
- 3. The name of the governing body is Mersey Vale Primary School Governing Body
- 4. The governing body shall consist of:
- (a) Four parent governors
- (b) One LA governor
- (c) One staff governor
- (d) The Headteacher
- (e) Four co-opted governors
- 5. Total number of governors: 11
- 6. The term of office for all categories of governor will be four years
- 7. This instrument of government comes into effect on 12 July 2015
- 8. This instrument was made by order of Stockport Local Authority on 22nd July 2015.
